A Challenging Year

It has been a challenging year for everybody with Corona virus running rampant through our communities causing us to make major changes to the way we live our lives. NRVT has been impacted less than many nonprofits as we are run entirely by volunteers. However, restrictions placed on travel meant that Chris and I were unable to make our planned trip to Jaleshwori in October and lockdowns in Nepal caused the purchase of land for the Community Farm to be put on hold.

Emergency Food distribution in Kathmandu

More seriously the constraints put in place due to the epidemic have caused severe hardship to the millions of Nepalese who rely on the tourist industry for their livelihood. This includes hotel workers and street vendors as well as the thousands of trekking guides, cooks and porters.

In the UK and France the governments stepped in with furlough schemes and state aid for businesses impacted by Covid. In Nepal the government did very little, obliging nonprofits working in the region to get involved and help people who were literally running out of food.



Pasang Tamang with his team at NRVT Nepal were able to obtain a list of families in serious difficulty and, following a campaign on Facebook, NRVT Europe were able to send over money to purchase rice, lentils, sugar and cooking oil. Distribution was authorised by the Kathmandu Social Welfare Council and carried out by Pasang and the other trustees in Nepal.

In total, 101 families were provided with enough essential food supplies to see them through the winter. We were very relieved to have the apparatus in place to be able to help these families quickly and efficiently. Many thanks to everyone who contributed.

Jaleshwori Community Farm

We are excited to report that now, as I write, Pasang is in Aiselukharka – the local administrative centre, three hours walk from Jaleshwori – completing the papers to buy the farm land. He has already obtained official permission for the purchase from the Social Welfare Council in Kathmandu, to whom we were obliged to send letters to
